By now the word has reached most that 3M announced at the end of April that it is closing and selling its private resort, also known as Wonewok. The most conclusive article about the initial announcement remains the Park Rapids Enterprise story (https://rb.gy/daiu8).

Since then there have been many, many conversations wondering what can be done to try and preserve the pristine nature of the site. There have also been rumors the destiny is preordained, that it has been sold, or that RDO (the Potato folks in Park Rapids?!!) had signed up to purchase it.

Currently we have no reason to believe any of these rumors are credible. One insight we have had is that the brokers who 3M has turned to for sale of the property told the

StarTribune they weren't even sure how to value the property, indicating that it is likely things are still very much in the early stages, even at the time of writing this.

While much remains unknown, one thing we can provide is that we have been in contact with several organizations whose mission is to protect and preserve pristine areas and shorelines, working with many other groups that may be able to use their resources to contribute to a larger plan to procure and manage the land.



One of the more interesting bits to come of the conversations was identifying some of the possible areas of focus that Mantrap and its shoreline might provide and lean on for funds to preserve it ... Loon Propagation, Clean Water Critical Habitat Plan Lake, Muskie Fishery, Cold Water Tullibee Refuge Lake, Headwaters of a Chain of Lakes, the list goes on and on. No doubt that if simply raising funds from various programs and grants is the challenge there would be several to pull from, if not all of them!

With all that said, it is important to understand based on previous successes that these things take time. It is not unusual for months, even years, to pass before a plan can be put into motion. Also there is no expectation at this time that the lake would need to raise funds for purchasing of any sort, however it is possible that when the time comes we may solicit for some assistance helping to cover the legal costs to orchestrate a final plan.

So at this time the most we can ask is for patience and positivity. There could be some bumps along the way but rest assured the best people in the region, the state, possibly the country are pursuing every option to protect a once-in-modern-history opportunity. At the end of it, with the ball ultimately in 3M's court, no one will be able to say every possibility wasn't explored and presented.

I am leading a small committee of neighbors that continue to meet to ensure no detail is overlooked, and that a unified approach is maintained. Though we don't have a lot to share, if anyone has thoughts or ideas, we do have direct channels to some of the parties making inroads, so please do not hesitate to reach out to me (rich.halvorsen@gmail.com) if you have any thoughts or concerns.

## **Letter from the President**

Just by chance when parting ways we were both heading towards Park Rapids, so I offered to lead him to the Hubbard County Historical Society. He was hoping to see if there was anything resembling a file on the Wonewok property history. Being a bit of a history nut I couldn't help but follow him inside.

Wherever the Mantrap experience may wander a generation from now, like those before us this will be history that deserves to be remembered while similar history will come that has yet to be written for those who follow.
